Categorising ultras will weaken efforts to root out terror

Democratic polity & radical ideologies can't mix: India

United Nations, Feb 6: India has underlined the need to distinguish between political ideologies that are part of a pluralistic democratic polity and the radical ideologies that subscribe to terrorism, emphasising that any attempt to paint both of them with the same brush is "inaccurate" and "counterproductive".

Speaking at the Ambassador-level Annual Briefing to Member States organised by the United Nations Office

of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT), India's Permanent Representative to the UN Ambassador TS. Timmanti said India has always maintained that nations should not go back to pre-9/11 era when terrorists were being divided into 'your terrorist' and 'my terrorist'.

He said the categorising them weakens the collective resolve to combat terrorism.

We see a renewal of this attempt by trying

to divide terror again into categories and label them. For example, under the label of xenophobia, racism, and other forms of intolerance or in the name of religion or belief, efforts have been made to bring into this discussion categories such as right-wing extremism, far right and far left extremism, violent nationalism, racially ethnically motivated violent nationalism, he said.

Timmanti said there

is a need to understand that in democracies right-wing and left-wing are part of the polity and come to power through elections reflecting the majority will of the people.

Democracy by definition contains a broad spectrum of ideologies and beliefs. We need to distinguish between the political ideologies which are part of a pluralistic democratic polity, as against radical ideologies which subscribe to terrorism.

Our fight is against such radical ideologies and not against democracy. To paint them with the same brush is inaccurate and counterproductive, he said.

Amid efforts to prepare report of the Secretary-General mandated by the General Assembly to assess the threat posed by the terrorist acts on the basis of xenophobia, racism, and other forms of intolerance, or in the name of religion or belief, Timmanti underlined that we should not be selective in our approach but in fact seek to implement a zero-tolerance against terror.

Timmanti, currently the Chair of the 1988 Sanctions Committee as well as of the Counter-terrorism Committee of the Security Council, said the overall threat of terrorism has only increased.

The threat posed by al-Qaeda, ISIL, and their affiliates in Asia as well as in Africa, and their links with those designated under 1267 need to be recognised and addressed, Timmanti said.

He said the recent report of 1988 Taliban Sanctions Committee highlighted how the close link between the Taliban, especially through the Haqqani network, and al-Qaeda and other terrorist groups still continues.

We need to ensure that radical groups in one region do not draw sustenance from another, he said.

Timmanti said he looked forward to enhancing synergies between the Counter-Terrorism Committee (CTC) and the United Nations Office of Counter-Terrorism (UNOCT), both of which play complementary roles.

One of the aspects, which has not been fully explored is the role victims of terrorism and their networks can play in countering terrorism. We know that the UNOCT has put a spotlight on this issue. We are also reaching out to civil society to support our efforts on counter-terrorism, he said.



Elizabeth anoints Camilla as future queen

In a significant intervention, Queen Elizabeth II has said that the Duchess of Cornwall will be Queen when Prince Charles becomes the King.

Queen Elizabeth II used her Platinum Jubilee national message on Saturday to back Camilla, shaping the future of the monarchy.

The Queen expressed her "sincere wish" that Camilla will be known as Queen Consort when Prince Charles becomes King.

As she reached her 70th year on the throne, Elizabeth II, set out her hopes for her daughter-in-law, once a royal mistress and now certain to be called Queen and crowned at Charles's side.

The Queen, 95, said in the written message: "I would like to express my thanks to you all for your support. I remain eternally grateful for, and humbled by, the loyalty and affection that you continue to give me." "And when, in the fullness of time, my son Charles becomes King, I know you will give him and his wife Camilla the same support that you have given me; and it is my sincere wish that, when that time comes, Camilla will be known as Queen Consort as she continues her own loyal service," she said.

Gandhi statue vandalised in New York; India flays act

New York, Feb 6: A life-sized bronze statue of Mahatma Gandhi was vandalised in a New York City neighbourhood on Saturday, an act strongly condemned as 'despicable' by the Consulate General of India here.

The 8-foot-high statue, located in Manhattan's Union Square, was defaced by some unknown persons, the Consulate General of India said.

The Consulate condemns this act of vandalism in the strongest terms, it said,

adding that the matter has been taken up with local authorities.

The matter has also been taken up with the US State Department for immediate investigation and urged appropriate action against those responsible for this despicable act, it said.

The incident has shocked the Indian-American community here.

Leading diaspora organisation Federation of Indian Associations - New York, New Jersey and Connecticut (FIANY NJ CT) strongly

condemned the cowardly act perpetrated against the statue of the Father of the Nation.

It is a very sad moment to see somebody whose perverseness is to the extent where they chose to deface a statue of a distinguished leader and personality who is known globally for the message of peace and non-violence, FIA Chairman Ankur Vaidya told PTI.

Vaidya "very strongly" condemned this act and urged authorities to take strict action against those who carried

out the vandalism.

He added that it must be ensured that the course of justice prevails in a rapid manner for this cowardly act.

We personally, as individuals and as organisations, should write to the Mayor's Office to take the strictest action for those responsible for this kind of cowardly act of defacing the statue of our Father of the Nation, he said.

The statue was donated by the Gandhi Memorial International Foundation, and was dedicated on October 2, 1986 to mark the 117th birth anniversary of Gandhi.

American civil rights leader Bayard Rustin had delivered a keynote speech at the ceremony.

Incidentally, the statue was removed in 2001, conserved and reinstalled in a landscape garden area in 2002.

This is not the first time a statue of Gandhi has been desecrated in the US.

In January last year, unknown miscreants had vandalised, broken and ripped from the base a statue of Gandhi in a park in the US state of California, evoking a strong response from India which sought a thorough investigation and appropriate action against those responsible for the "despicable act".

Queen Elizabeth II first monarch to celebrate 70 years of reign

London, Feb 6: Queen Elizabeth II will on Sunday become the first British monarch to celebrate a platinum jubilee, marking 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms and the Commonwealth.

To celebrate the unprecedented anniversary of the 95-year-old the monarch, events and initiatives will take place throughout the year, culminating in a four-day UK bank holiday weekend from Thursday June 2 to Sunday June 5.

The bank holiday will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the UK to come together to celebrate the historic milestone.

The four days of celebrations will include public events and community activities, as well as national moments of reflection on the Queen's 70 years of

service.

In addition, initiatives including The Queen's Green Canopy and the Platinum Pudding competition will create a lasting reminder of the Queen's Jubilee, while The Queen's private estates will also join in with special jubilee themed events offering more opportunities for members of the public to celebrate the historic milestone.

To mark the occasion, a nationwide baking competition sets out to find a brand new pudding dedicated to the Queen.

The Big Jubilee Lunch and Fortnum & Mason are inviting applications from UK residents aged eight and over to create the perfect Platinum Pudding recipe.

Five finalists will prepare their pudding for an expert judging panel including Dame Mary Berry, Monica Galetti and Buckingham Palace Head Chef Mark Flanagan.

The winning recipe will be made available to the public and the pudding will be enjoyed at Big Jubilee Lunches during the Jubilee weekend, and by generations to come.

The Queen's Birthday Parade (Trooping the Colour), over 1,400 parading soldiers, 200 horses and 400 musicians will come together in the traditional parade to mark The Queen's official birthday, usually held on the second Saturday in June.

Beginning at Buckingham Palace, the parade will move down The Mall to Horse Guard's Parade, joined by Members of the Royal Family on horseback and in carriages.

The parade will close with the traditional Royal Air Force fly-past, watched by The Queen and Members of the Royal Family from the Buckingham Palace balcony.

24 peacekeepers killed in 2021 attacks, says UN

United Nations, Feb 6: Twenty-four UN peacekeepers and one civilian working for the United Nations were killed in deliberate attacks during 2021, according to the United Nations Staff Union.

Two of the peacekeepers killed were women, and for the eighth year in a row Mali was the world's most dangerous with 19 peacekeepers killed, the union's Standing Committee for the Security and Independence of the International Civil Service said. Central African Republic was second on the list with four peacekeeper deaths.

Once again, United Nations staff members, especially 'blue helmets', serving in the world's most dangerous places paid the highest price, UN Staff Union president Aitor Aranz said in a statement Friday.

No one was apprehended and sentenced for such crimes, he said. We call on governments to do the utmost to protect United Nations personnel and prosecute their killers.

Eight peacekeepers who died in 2021 were from Togo, four from Chad, three from Ivory Coast, three from Egypt and one each from Rwanda, Burundi, Congo, Gabon, Malawi

and Morocco, the Staff Union said. The one civilian killed was from Congo.

The 25 killings in 2021 bring the death toll to at least 462 United Nations and associated personnel killed in deliberate attacks in the past 11 years from improvised explosive devices, rocket-propelled grenades, artillery fire, mortar rounds, land mines, ambushes, convoy attacks, suicide attacks and targeted assassinations, the Staff Union said.

Last year's death toll compares to 15 killings in 2020, 28 in 2019, 34 in 2018 and 71 in 2017.

US nod for Masood as Pak Envoy to Washington

Islamabad, Feb 6: Pakistan on Saturday said the US Government has approved the nomination of Sardar Masood Khan as its Ambassador to Washington, days after a prominent US Congressman urged President Joe Biden to reject his diplomatic credentials and termed him a bona fide terrorist sympathiser.

Khan, who has previously served as the president of Pakistan-occupied Kashmir (PoK) until August last year, was nominated as Pakistan's Ambassador to the US in November.

The US Government

has conveyed its agreement to the appointment of Sardar Masood Khan as the Ambassador of Pakistan to the United States. He would assume his responsibilities in Washington D.C., in due course of time, Foreign Office spokesperson Asim Iftikhar said in a statement, adding that Khan was a seasoned diplomat who had served Pakistan with distinction and honour.

The agreement is the approval of a designated

diplomat by the receiving state.

Khan had previously served as Pakistan's permanent representative to the UN in Geneva and New York and as Ambassador to China.

He will be replacing the outgoing Ambassador of Pakistan in Washington Asad Majeed Khan.

Republican Congressman Scott Perry, in a letter to President Biden last week, expressed grave concern about the nomination of Khan as

Pakistan's ambassador to the United States.

"(Pakistan Prime Minister) Imran Khan's nomination of a bona fide terrorist sympathiser working to undermine our interests in the region, as well as the security of our Indian allies, can only be described as a breathtaking lack of judgment at best, and a demonstration of Islamabad's unmitigated contempt for the United States at worst," he wrote.

China hails Pak as neighbourhood priority

Beijing, Feb 6: Chinese Premier Li Keqiang on Saturday said that Pakistan is a priority in China's neighbourhood diplomacy as he met his Pakistani counterpart Imran Khan who assured him that his government will do its utmost to ensure the safety of Chinese nationals and projects in his country.

Li, the second-ranking leader of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC) after Chinese President Xi Jinping, has expressed China's willingness to strengthen all-dimensional practical cooperation with Pakistan, state-run Xinhua news agency reported.

China always takes Pakistan as a priority in its neighbourhood diplomacy and

supports Pakistan's pursuit of prosperity, Li said, highlighting the importance China attaches to its close strategic ties with Pakistan.

Khan is here at the invitation of the Chinese government and attended the opening ceremony of the Beijing Winter Olympics on Friday.

Exchanging views on the regional security situation, Khan highlighted the "serious situation" in Jammu and Kashmir, Pakistan's state-run APP news agency reported. However, the Xinhua news agency did not mention the Kashmir issue in its report on the meeting between Li and Khan.

Khan highlighted that the strategic ties between Pakistan and

China served the fundamental interests of the two countries and were a factor of peace and stability in the region.

He said the successful celebrations of the 70th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic relations held last year injected a new impetus to the bilateral friendship.

Li said that China supports its enterprises to invest in Pakistan and appreciates the Pakistani government's efforts to safeguard the safety of Chinese firms and personnel in the country.

Li, in his meeting with Khan, said that China will actively consider expanding the import of agricultural products from Pakistan.

Khan said that the all-weather strategic

cooperative partnership with China is the cornerstone of Pakistan's foreign policy.

Pakistan is firmly committed to the flagship project of the China Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) and will continue strengthening cooperation in multiple fields, he said, adding that the country will do its utmost to ensure the safety of the Chinese people and projects in Pakistan.

Prime Minister Khan appreciated the transformational impact of the CPEC on Pakistan's infrastructure, energy, socio-economic development and improvement in livelihoods of the people.
