Iswarya Hospital saves extremely premature twin babies

Chennai, Feb 4:

In a remarkable life-saving effort, Iswarya Hospital, OMR, Chennai, successfully treated extremely premature twin female babies born at just 27 weeks of gestation, each weighing 1.1 kg, and suffering from multiple life-threatening complications. The twins, born to a 25-year-old woman in Pondicherry, had severe respiratory distress, unstable vital signs, low immunity and jaundice due to extreme prematurity. Following an emergency caesarean section at a private hospital in Pondicherry, the critically ill newborns were trans-

ported to Chennai in a specially equipped NICU ambulance with mechanical ventilation, under the supervision of Dr. S. Ravi, Senior Consultant Neonatologist, Iswarya Hospital. Admitted to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) in September 2025, the babies received advanced ventilatory support, surfactant therapy, intensive infection control and specialised nutritional care. Complications such as patent ductus arteriosus and recurrent apnoea were managed successfully by the multidisciplinary neonatal team. Despite the high risks associated with extreme prematurity, the

twins showed steady improvement, were gradually weaned off ventilator support and gained weight to 1.52 kg and 1.53 kg respectively. They were shifted to full oral feeds and discharged after 65 days of hospitalisation. The babies are currently healthy with no major complications. Dr. S. Ravi said the timely transfer, immediate intensive care and continuous monitoring were critical in saving the twins, highlighting the hospital's advanced neonatal care facilities and dedicated medical team.

Tiruvannamalai collector inspects ongoing development schemes

Tiruvannamalai, Feb 4: The Collector of Tiruvannamalai, K. Tharparagari, inspected various development scheme works being implemented under the Kilpennathur Panchayat Union. During the inspection, the Collector visited Keeranur Village Panchayat, where he reviewed the newly completed Panchayat Office building constructed as per the approved estimate. He planted saplings on the premises and instructed officials to ensure proper maintenance of the office and its surroundings.
